Sylvester Judd says that Daniel Alvord lived at Worthington, Mass. and Chenango Co., N. Y. U. S. Census of 1790 makes him a resident of Lanesboro, Mass. for that year. Wadsworth's Ledger calls him of Lanesboro in 1796. In 1808 he was elected a justice in DeRuyter, N. Y., was called "Squire" Alvord and was recognized as a man of worth and integrity. At the first town meeting of Georgetown, N. Y., he was elected assessor. He died at the home of his son Job, with whom he and his wife lived in their old age, and was buried in the country cemetery of DeRuyter.

Rev. War Service: "Alvord, Daniel, Private, Capt. Jonathan Stern's Co., Col. Dickinson's Reg., commanded by Maj. Jonathan Clapp. Enlisted July 9, 1777; dis. July 23, 1777; service 14 days on alarm at Ticonderoga."

"Alvord, Daniel, Northampton, Private, Capt. Oliver Lyman's Co. Enlisted Aug. 17, 1777; service 7 days. Marched to East Hoosac on an alarm. Also Capt. Lyman's Co., Col. Ezra May's Reg. Enlisted Sept. 20, 1777; dis. Oct. 14, 1777; service 30 days on an expedition to Stillwater and Saratoga. Also descriptive list of men enlisted from Hampshire Co. for the term of nine months from the time of their arrival at Fishkill, June 16, 1778, Capt. Cook's Co., Col. Chapin's Reg. Age 29 years; stature, 5-10; complexion black; residence, Northampton. Also Capt. Ebenezer Strong's Co., 2nd Hampshire Co. Reg. Pay roll for 2 days' service at Northampton, June 16 and 17, 1782 by order of Elisha Porter, sheriff." (Mass. Soldiers in Rev.)

Daniel Alvord applied for a pension May 18, 1818, claim allowed. Application states that he took part in the battle of Long Island. Residence given as Georgetown, N. Y.
