

982. Broughton, b. South Hadley, Mass., Jan. 14, 1802; d. So. Hadley, Mass., July 16, 1886. He was educated at the common schools and began his business life as a boatman on Conn. River in 1826. Later he became captain of a boat and then agent and part owner in the Transportation Co. with headquarters at Hartford during the season. In 1846 the Co. sold their business to the Conn. Valley R. R. and in 1853 Mr. Alvord became connected with the Parsons Paper Co. being one of the projectors. He was Pres. of the Valley Paper Co. from its organization in 1866. In politics he was a Democrat and held the office of Selectman many years. A man of sound judgment and held in high esteem. He was unmarried.
