Y., May 23, 1812; died Markland, Ind., Apr. 23, 1906; married Louisville Ky., Jan. 1, 1840, Susan Summerfield Tapp, daughter of Berkett and Eliza (Duncan) Tapp of Culpepper Co., Va. She was born Ky., 1817; died near Vevay, Ind., Dec. 25, 1893. Res. Cincinnati, O. and Markland, Ind. No children.

Mr. Alvord adopted a boy, Charles V. Efner, who served in the Civil War under the name Charles V. Alvord, in Co. D, 93rd Ind. Reg., Vol. Inf. He was living at Keokuk, Ia. in 1903.

Brewster Clarke Alvord in early life was a ham canvasser and trimmer in the house of Charles and Samuel Davis, pork-packers, Cincinnati, O. In later life he lived on a farm six miles N. E. of Vevay, Ind. He was a straight-forward man and good citizen. In his extreme old age he became dependent upon the charity of his friends.
