

Mr. Alvord was a man of broad views and of great energy, a bitter opponent of monopolies. Though he was not closely identified with either political party, he was urged to accept the nomination for mayor, but he declined. In all his dealings he was generous and of strict integrity. His widow still lives (1908) at Syracuse, N. Y.
