John Jacob Mang Alvord was a ship chandler and carpenter, being also connected with transportation on the lakes and canals. At one time he had charge of twelve new boats sent from Oswego by way of Lakes Ontario and Erie to the Maumee River, where he remained during the season and contracted the "Maumee Fever," which seriously impaired his health.

Mr. Alvord and his wife made the journey to Mo. in company with his father and brother, Harvey. Arriving at St. Louis, he declined to proceed farther, owing to a misunderstanding with reference to the assignment of the land. He remained at St. Louis for two years, working at his trade, then returned to Oswego, N. Y. He was much interested in horticulture, and with his wife had charge of the Oswego Orphan Asylum for two years, resigning in 1861, by reason of ill-health.

His widow was matron for several years at Sing Sing and the Utica Asylum. She married Jan. 18, 1875, Benjamin Treat of New Milford, Conn. After Mr. Treat's death she lived with her daughter, Delia M. Harris of Oswego, N. Y.
