He was born Northampton, Mass., Dec. 5, 1814; died Worcester, Mass., Mar. 27, 1862. Res. Worcester, Mass. Children:

Jonathan H. Knight was a merchant in Worcester, Mass., engaged in the wholesale fur business. His first wife was Persis Goodman, by whom he had one son, J. H. Knight, now pres. of 1st Nat. Bank, Hartford, Conn. Mr. Knight was a man of ideas and great energy.

SAMUEL ALVORD (*Sewall, Samuel, John, John, Jonathan, Alexander*), born West Springfield, Mass., Nov. 30, 1812; died Chicopee, Mass., Feb. 5, 1892; married Springfield, Mass., June 14, 1836, Mary Wood, daughter of Jonathan and Lydia Wood. She was born Pelham, Mass., Apr. 22, 1812; died Chicopee, Mass., Apr. 19, 1898. Res. Chicopee Falls, Mass. No children.

"Samuel Alvord's education was limited to the district schools and a few terms at Wilbraham and Westfield. After leaving the academy he taught for a number of years, but never lost sight of his intended life-work, the study of medicine.

"As principal of the High School at Chicopee Falls, Mass., he showed that he was a born educator. In the practice of medicine he displayed unusual power. No homeopathic doctor in the Conn. Valley commanded a wider or more successful practice. He was a member of the Mass. Homeopathic Soc. and American Institute of Homeopathy."—(Conn. Valley Men).
