Samuel Morgan Alvord (the author of this work), received his early training on his mother's farm in Bolton, Conn. His desire to continue his education beyond the district school of his native town was gratified, when he reached the age of eighteen years. At this time he entered the Hartford Public High School from which institution he graduated in 1892 with the highest honors in scholarship. The following autumn he entered the academic department of Yale University and graduated in the class of 1896. Mr. Alvord stood second in entrance examinations in Greek in competition for the Hugh Chamberlain Greek prize. He also received a Berkeley premium for efficiency in Latin composition. He was a member of the *Phi Beta Kappa* scholarship society and of the *Alpha Delta Phi* fraternity, also president of the Yale Union.

After graduation Mr. Alvord was appointed instructor in Greek and Latin at Pennington Seminary, Pennington, N. J., which position he filled until 1900 when he was elected to his present position, instructor in Latin at the Hartford Public High School, Hartford, Conn. In 1908 Mr. Alvord was chosen deacon in the Farmington Avenue Congregational Church. He is deeply interested in church and Sunday school work.

Mrs. Mary (O'Hanlon) Alvord graduated at Pennington Seminary in the class of 1884. She was engaged as teacher at the Seminary until her marriage. Mrs. Alvord's father, Rev. Thomas O'Hanlon, was for many years president of Pennington Seminary and leader of the Ocean Grove Bible Class. He has long been a prominent worker in the Methodist Church and many have been led to Christ through his preaching and teaching.
