

- PATRICK ALVORD, from New England, settled in Attica, N. Y., in 1805 (County Hist.).
- Administration of estate of JOHN ALVORD, of Brookfield, N. Y., in 1815, granted to Ezekiel and Sally Bascom; Sally Bascom was his widow (Madison Co., N. Y., Sur. Rec.) Ezekiel Bascom, was born in Union, Conn., in 1773, and died Brookfield, N. Y., 1843. Bascom genealogy states that he married Sally, widow of *William* Alvord, which is undoubtedly an error.
- LUCINDA CANDEE, born about 1775; married —ALVORD, and resided at Mexico, N. Y., (Candee Gen.).
- DEBORAH ALVORD, born Sept. 8, 1807; married Subbinus Pierce, a native of Monson, Mass.; res. in vicinity of Monson, Mass., and removed to Manchester, O., (Ballou and Pierce Gens.).
- WILLIAM B. ALVORD—also called "Bill Alvord, director of Young Men's Temperance Society, Detroit, Mich., 1835 (Mich. Pioneer Collection).
- JOHN ALVORD, in 1862 received from William Baker and wife 60 acres of land in the town of Mina, N. Y. (Chautauqua Co., Reg. of Deeds).
- JAMES ALVORD, and Rosannah McCorney, married Dec. 9, 1836; Eliza Jane, their daughter, b. July 2, 1844, d. Apr. 2, 1845. (Marblehead, Mass., Vital Rec.).
- LEWIS HENRY ALVORD, appointed cadet to West Point from Mo., in 1866, by Congressman Henry T. Blow, was not admitted. (West Point Rec.).
- Widow CLARISSA ALVORD, (probably Alford) of Farmington, Conn.; married, Apr. 16, 1854, Ithurel Thompson Andrews, (Andrews Gen.).
- HENRY ALVORD, machinist, Boston, Mass., 1850, (Directory).
- CHARLES C. ALVORD, machinist, Boston, Mass., 1887, (Directory).
- CASPER ALVORD, male assist. at Absentee Shawnee Indian School, appointed from Kan.; born in Indian Territory. (Gov. Direc. 1893).
- E. G. ALVORD, JR. Hartford, Conn., 1884. (Directory).
- FRED ALVORD, at Orange, O., about 1895 (Postmaster).
- HENRY and SILAS ALVORD, at Bowling Green, Mo., about 1890. (Christopher S. Alvord).
- HARRY C. ALVORD, author of "A History of the Coal Strike," 1903.
- JOHN ALVORD, resided at Milford, Kan., in 1888, interviewed by Elmus F. Alvord; came from Vt.; did not know names of parents.
- JOHN P. ALVORD, Phila., Pa., 1897. (Directory).
- MARJORY, widow of JONATHAN ALVORD, Phila., Pa. (Directory).
- JOHN J. ALVORD, saddler and harness maker, Madison, Wis., 1850.
- JOHN ALVORD, and Martha (Curtin) Alvord had a son George, b. Hartford, Conn., Jan. 6, 1877; father a mason, age 32, born in Conn.; four other children living.
- MARTIN and MARY (Selden) ALVORD, had daughter, Mary, b. in Hartford,
