The papers of James Louis Robertson, chief clerk of the U.S. Senate Post Office, special agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reserve naval officer, deputy comptroller, and member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, were given to the Library of Congress by Robertson between 1975 and 1983.

## Scope and Content Note

The papers of James Louis Robertson (1907-1994) span the years 1869-1982, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1928-1982. The collection consists of correspondence, diaries, speeches, writings, subject files, genealogical material, newspaper clippings, and other papers relating primarily to Robertson's service as a member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System. Included is material pertaining to the U.S. Federal Banking Commission and the U.S. Federal Open Market Committee, diaries of Robertson's father, Andrew J. Robertson, and a draft of Robertson's book, *What Generation Gap??? A Dialogue on America* (1970).
