Scope and Content Note

The papers of Francis LeJau Parker (1873-1966) span the years 1905-1935 and consist mainly of official material gathered in connection with his duties during World War I and as a member of special missions to Latin America, especially in the Tacna-Arica dispute in 1926 between Chile and Peru and in the Nicaraguan elections of 1928. Much of the material is printed or mimeographed and often includes maps and handwritten notes. The collection is organized by subject and therein by topic or type of material. An addition is focused largely on files relating to Mexico and the Philippines and some general correspondence and miscellaneous reports and memoranda.

The collection contains reports by Parker made while on duty with the Romanian and Russian armies in 1916 and 1917 and estimates by him of Russia's political future. The collection also contains staff lectures on battles and campaigns of the war. Other material includes accounts of a disputed plebiscite in the Tacna-Arica area in 1926, and voluminous notes, drafts, and reports of American supervision of the presidential elections in Nicaragua in 1928. Parker was vice chairman of the election board. Still other material pertains to American assistance to Puerto Rico during a hurricane of 1929. Parker's tour as chief of the United States Bureau of Insular Affairs from 1929-1933 is reflected on files relating to the Philippines. An addition contains more material on the Philippines and also a monograph and others items pertaining to Mexico.
