The Woodbury Lowery Collection Relating to Spanish Settlements in the United States was a gift of the Lowery estate in 1907.

The collection was processed after receipt in 1907. The finding aid was revised in 2008.

The collection of Woodbury Lowery (1853-1906) relating to Spanish settlements in the United States spans the years 1517-1803 and consists of bound volumes of material gathered and organized by Woodbury for the preparation of his unfinished history of "Spanish Settlements within the Present Limits of the United States," containing catalog records and handwritten transcripts of documents concerning California, Florida, Louisiana, New Mexico, and Texas.
