Scope and Content Note

The Charles A. Lindbergh (1902-1974) Spirit of St. Louis Collection spans the years 1927-1969 and consists mainly of Burmese, Dutch, English, and Swedish editions of the *Spirit of St. Louis* by Lindbergh. Also in the collection are condensations of the book in foreign editions of the *Reader's Digest*, dated April and May 1954. Miscellaneous material includes files relating to the Daniel Guggenheim Medal Award, other biographical material, and scrapbooks concerning Lindbergh. The collection is organized into the following series: [*The Spirit of St. Louis*](#), [Miscellany](#), and [Oversize Scrapbooks](#). Included in addition to other languages is material in French, German, Japanese and Spanish.
